What is Epilepsy?

- A neurological condition
 characterised by recurrent seizures
 due to temporary disruption of
 electrical activity in the brain.
- 40+ types of epilepsy and 70+
 seizure types not all convulsive

Epilepsy Prevalence

- 1% or 250,000 Australians currently live with epilepsy
- 30,000 Queenslanders currently live with epilepsy
- 1 in 25 Australians will be diagnosed with epilepsy in their lifetime.



Living with Epilepsy

- Cognitive impacts
- Tiredness / fatigue
- Medication side effects
- Driving / independence
- Mental health
- Stigma / culture
- Employment / schooling







EMPLOYMENT

45% of adults diagnosed with epilepsy will experience a change to their employment.



Students with epilepsy have a 78% higher risk of not completing Year 10 and are three times more likely to score below national average on NAPLAN.

"...when it comes to employment, it is not the seizure control failure that is the limiting factor. **The simple** declaration of being a person living with epilepsy works as a social barrier, often an insurmountable one."
