
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# Bentley Park College at a Glance


#### After Year 12



## Health Support Services & Community Services

HLT23215 + CHC22015

Bentley Park College commenced delivery of these qualifications in 2019 through a Partnership Agreement with Connect 'n' Grow. These qualifications provide a basic understanding of the skills required to work within Aged Care, Disability and Health.

The Health Support Service qualification reflects the role of workers who provide support for the effective functioning of health services. At this level workers complete tasks under supervision involving known routines and procedures or complete routine but variable tasks in collaboration with others in a team environment.

The Community Service qualification may be used as a pathway for workforce entry as a community service worker who provide a first point of contact and assist individuals in meeting their immediate needs.





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#### Health Services Assistant

In 2022 Bentley Park College will be looking to extend our students into the Certificate III in Health Services Assistant. Training will be provided for the right students to progress and extend their learning further as an Assistant in Nursing (AIN)

This qualification reflects the role of a variety of workers who use a range of factual, technical and procedural knowledge to provide assistance to health professional staff for the care of clients.

Elective units have been selected from Health, Community Service and Business Training

Packages to be contextualised into a Secondary School environment. Students will gain a range of entry level skills that will enhance their ability to gain employment within the health industry.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander primary health care workers are employed across a range of settings throughout Queensland. They provide a critical role in ensuring better health outcomes for Indigenous people and communities.

Health workers are required to perform a number of tasks from basic health and wellness checks to community education, support and liaison between communities/individuals and other health professionals. This is the entry level qualification for health workers in Queensland.
